Sir After compliments to you, take the Liberty of in-  
forming you, that from informations I understand you have  
a large quantity of Land on the Scioto & Paint Creek for  
Sale. I would be glad to know it is generally a body of good Land.  
& advantageous for the settlement of Societies. A large Number  
have had some thoughts of purchasing fifteen or twenty miles  
Square for the settling of a Society. & have been informed you  
can supply us. Sir. I request the favor of you by the bearer Mr  
Progers to give me information of situation. quantity & quali-  
ty of your Land - What would be your Price per hundred. What  
your terms of Payment in taking such a quantity of Land as  
would settle two congregations. I suppose I could raise three  
hundred families to move as soon as convenient - but it is  
probable that the present circumstances of that country would  
require some time to make a settlement in it with prudence.  
You will likewise please to let me know at what time <sup>this</sup> winter  
you could make it convenient to take a ride & show a number  
of the Land who are desirous of seeing it; & the situation & advantages  
of that country promising a steady Population. If you should  
think it convenient to part with such a body of Land. & your terms  
would suit us give us soon a time that you could wait upon us to  
show the country & the land. I let me know by the bearer. I would im-  
mediately let you know whether your terms would suit us. & whe-  
ther we could wait upon you at the time you appointed - Your  
compliance would much oblige your humble servant.
