Deer Friend Tom : I received yours of the 233 and 29th of June, to-night, and although it is 12 o'clock, P. M. and I am very sleepy, I will write to you a few items. The train leaves at 6 o clock to-morrow morning. We are to remain here three months. Send me the Convie with letters in from the 78th. I have only received three letters since the 28th of May, and they were from you. Our Hegiment is improving in health. There has been an epochdis camp; the arrival of Mrs. Leggett. Mrs. Douglas, Mrs. Todd and Mrs. Colonel Leggett is acting Brigalier General, I will send you particulars in my next ALIE ADALLI CR. HANGON. July 12, 1862

GRAND JUNCTION, July 12th, 1862

Dear friend Tom:

I received yours of the 2ed and 29th of June to-night, and although it is 12 o'clock P.M. and I am very sleepy, I will write to you a few items. The train leaves at 6 o'clock tomorrow morning. We are to remain here three months. Send me the Courier with letters in from the 78th. I have only received three letters since the 28th of May, and they were from you. Our Regiment is improving in health. There has been an epoch in camp; the arrival of Mrs. Leggett, Mrs. Douglas, Mrs. Todd, and Mrs. Dana.
