## Letter from Zachariah Chandler to Thomas S. Armstrong

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Dubuau Nov. 21. 1861

Mr Armstrong

Would it not be well to make arrangements to have the ladies invited, provided a suitable house can be obtained? If they can be got out I think it will have a good effect. Of course, however, you must exercise your own judgement.

I was at Mr Bagley's on Tuesday evening, and I have strong hopes that Young Bagley and two or three of his friends will be on hand at your meeting to increase your list. Bagley goes if not prevented by his wife. — get out all you can — and especially get all ready to enlist, that is possible.

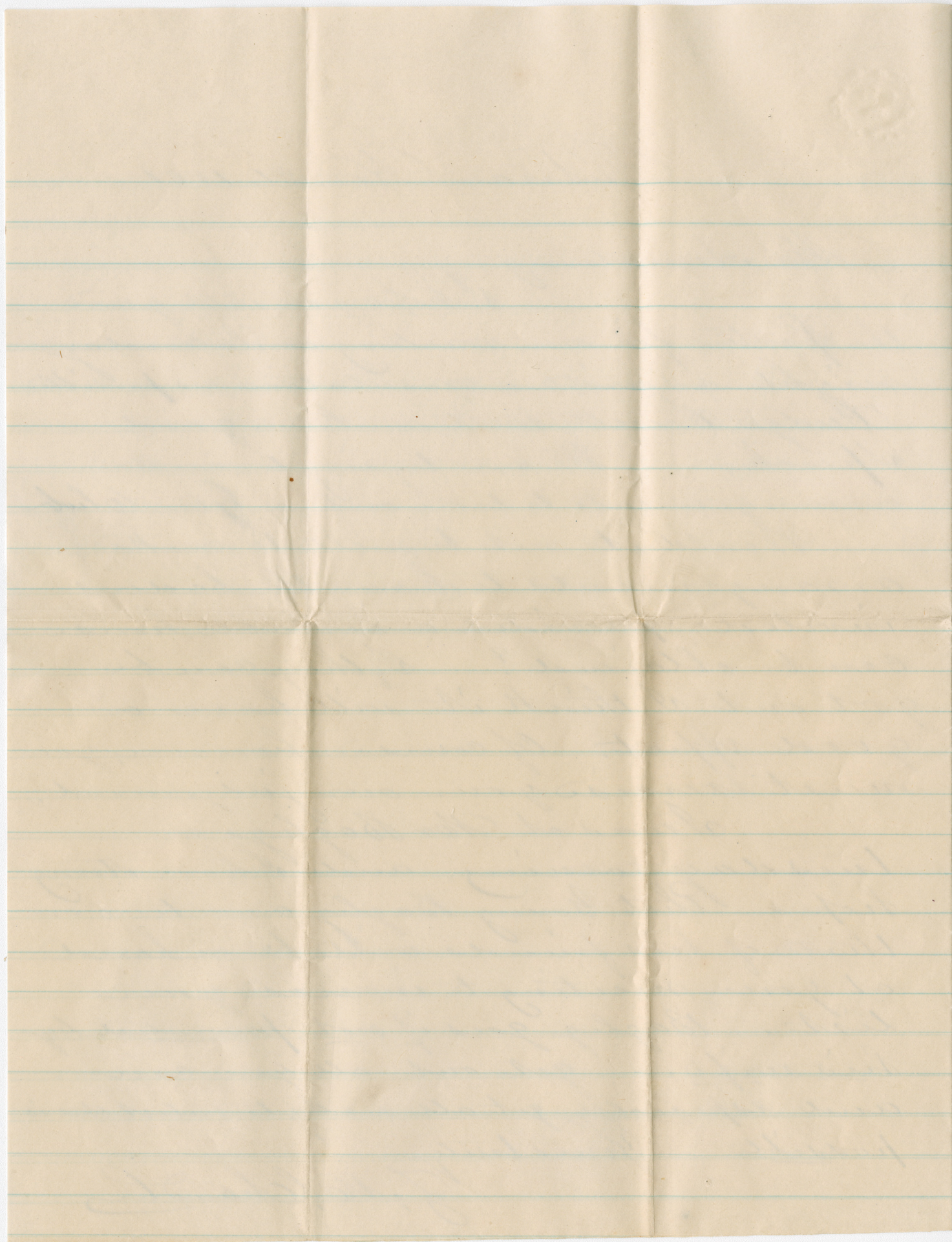
