Thursday afternoon Wilber is very much protrated. He is so weake, cannot help himself but has eaten more today than any before. His diet wine, whay, a little cream, brandy tody, beef, tea. He eats a piece of roasted apple today. Mr. Smith is attending to him most of the daytime. I have slept very little but have stood it well considering.
