Dear Friends at home

Having some leisure time I thought I would improve it by writing to you. I arrived here safe last Thursday and found everything prospering finely with the exception of Nero. Abram killed him the day he came home for killing one of Mr. Hull's lambs.

You better think Frank and were sorry when Frank got home and said he had seen Pa. Now he wanted to go back to Grandpa Armstrong's and play with Gus. He says for Jacob to take care of his nigger till he comes down. We have 22 lambs. Spencer Shipps is at home. He is discharged. He has been sick. Asa Lake got a letter from Jerry White last Saturday dated March the 24th. He says T.S. is sick.

I will have to close. I want you all to come up soon. Come up with Mary if you can. Good bye. Write soon. Yours
