## Letter from James Gilruth to James B. Finley

James Gilruth

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Jrville  
148 Feb 7, 1830

I snatch a moment this morning my dear Bro to ask after thy health & the prosperity of our Zion in your station — I bless God this hour I feel perfectly well in soul & body: & what need I more? — I believe Grace & Courage to do my duty will with Food & garment will complete the inventory of all I need (or desire in reference to myself) on earth with respect to grace, I am rewarded I shall have all <sup>I live</sup> from & for: & of the balance he that feeds the raven, & guards the Sparrow shall & will keep my provident. Then Glory to his excellent Majesty if him & will & trust. — & a small encumbrance of Member.

We have a general state of peace on Granville circuit, & The Radicals are doing us no harm of consequence, there has but one (& he a probationer) gone from us to them this year: & I am of opinion that there is scarcely another on Granville circuit that they will get.

B. Hooper has been some unwell; by which, on the whole he has lost perhaps half a round on the circuit. I have seen him but once since confluence, & that was at Off. Such is the form of our circuit —

Bro I feel some anxiety to know what is done, or going to be done with my Manuscript on Baptism! — It was known on this circuit while writing it, that I was writing on that subject: When asked, when I was going to have it printed, I told them I would give it to the M. E. C. to print, or not as it saw good. — The People (many of them) know I gave it to the confab, to print or not, & they now ask what is done with it? When shall we have them &c? I wish you would be so good as to let me know what is the ultimate determination in reference to it.

Our quor. II was good & joined — we had a blessed conference Bro you have no persecution from those poor Indians — it is Capt alone who has grumbled about the halling & Wm. W also says you were wrong in promising &c — My dear friend I feel for you your complaints mett my soul with sympathy — it had been good you had come out from urbane — Br Brown has engaged to survey the reservation M. Vincent is engaged to teach the school & superintend the boys for \$12 per Month in great hast & love yours — I — Gilchrist

I B. G. P.S. Our next quor is the 1<sup>st</sup> Sat & Sun of Aug —

I wrote some time ago to Dr Holaday, But I have received  
no answer. I suppose he has <sup>been</sup>, & perhaps is absent at Conferences etc.  
It will be no mortification to me if it should not be printed.  
It was for the interest of the M.E.C. I wrote it, but if it will not  
promote that, don't print it; let it be returned to me at Confer-  
ence, or when I call for it there; only be so good as to let me  
know what is the final determination & as soon as you can.

We have had a cold winter, & much snow; & the Drivel  
Disciples have had high glee in Sledding &c &c.

The <sup>last</sup> is in general pretty good, yet there has been a good many deaths  
recently but it is doubtful. — My family are well. My love to ~~the~~ of  
yours truly —
