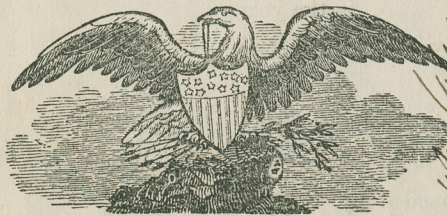

J. M. Chandler's Company, (B.) 78th Regiment of Ohio Vol. Infy. U.S.A. who
was enrolled on the 26th day of November one thousand eight hundred and Sixty One
to serve Three Years, is hereby Discharged from the service of the United States,
this First day of May, 1862, at Shiloh, Tennessee by reason
of Physical Disability
(No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.)*

Said Sergeant Armstrong was born in Licking County in the
State of Ohio, is Twenty six years of age, Five feet Ten inches
high, fair complexion, hazel eyes, Brown hair, and by occupation, when enrolled,
a Teacher

Given at Shiloh, Ten, this First day of May 1862.

*This sentence will be erased should there be any thing in the conduct
or physical condition of the soldier rendering him unfit for the Army.
