

If this is the case, I advise you never to marry him, if you do, you will soon become a widow. Keep this to yourself.

Tell me how this is about Dutch & Will Leggett. Give me all particulars. I have nothing to say. Tell her to consider well before she takes the step. I think well of him, but I think her good enough for any one. I don't care where he comes from or who he is. When you see him, tell him to write and give my respects. Give my best wishes one and all. Keep this all to yourself. Give all particulars. Yours as ever.
