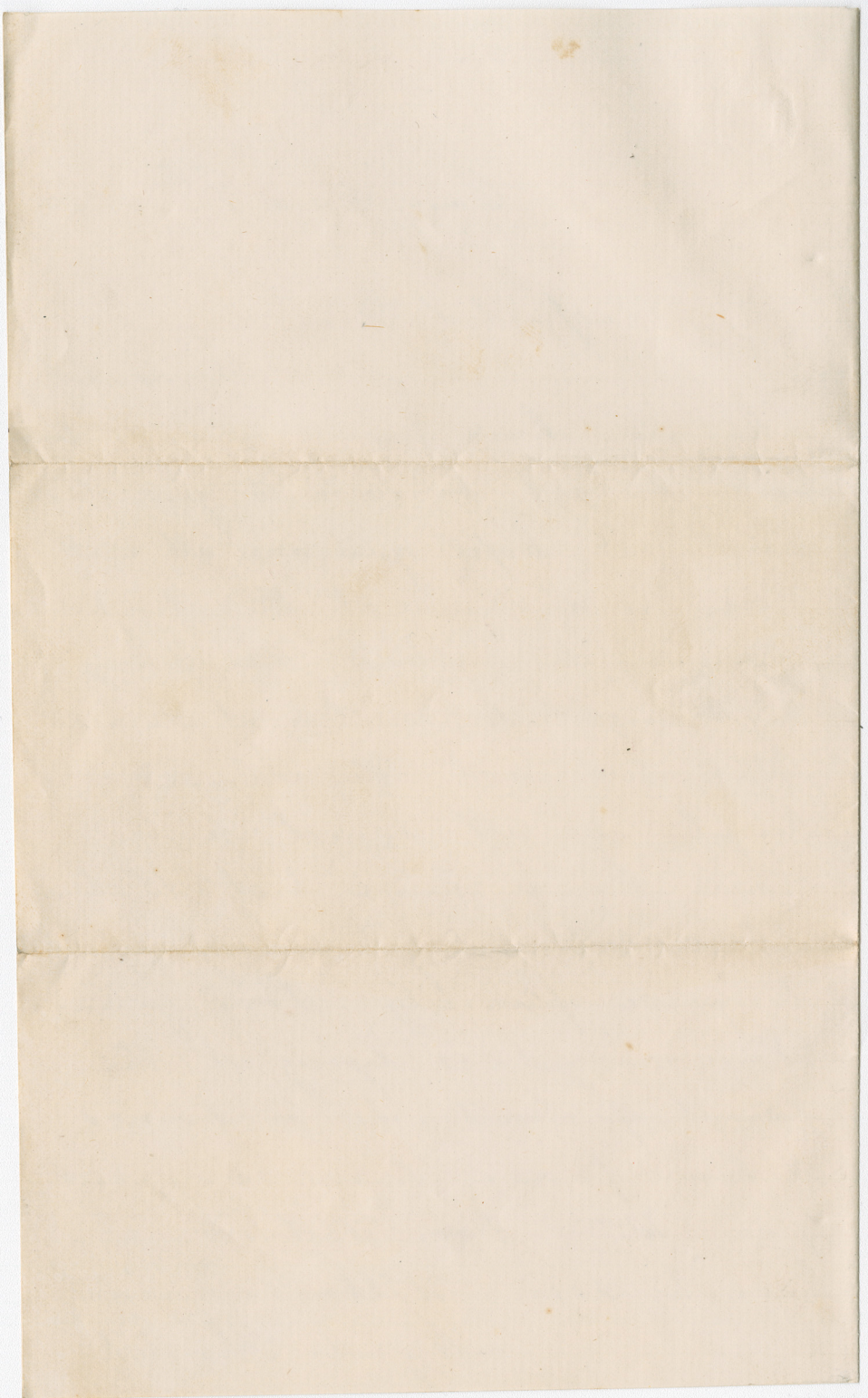
Respected Friend
