Oxford June 27th 1838

Brother Finley, Dear Sir
Through the blessing of God
I am in good health the which
I believe with one exception is in
a state of peace the case to which
I allude is as follows. Some time
ago I was called upon to settle a
difficulty between Sisters Watters
and Davis on the one part and
Sister Pool on the other according
to I visited the parties concerned
and finding Sisters Davis and
Watters disposed to settle the
difficulty on amicable terms
I hoped that it would soon
come to an end. To realize my
hope I got them all together but
I was disappointed in my expectation
of finding they would not settle it
themselves I thought it due to the
