Gainesville July 18<sup>th</sup> 1862

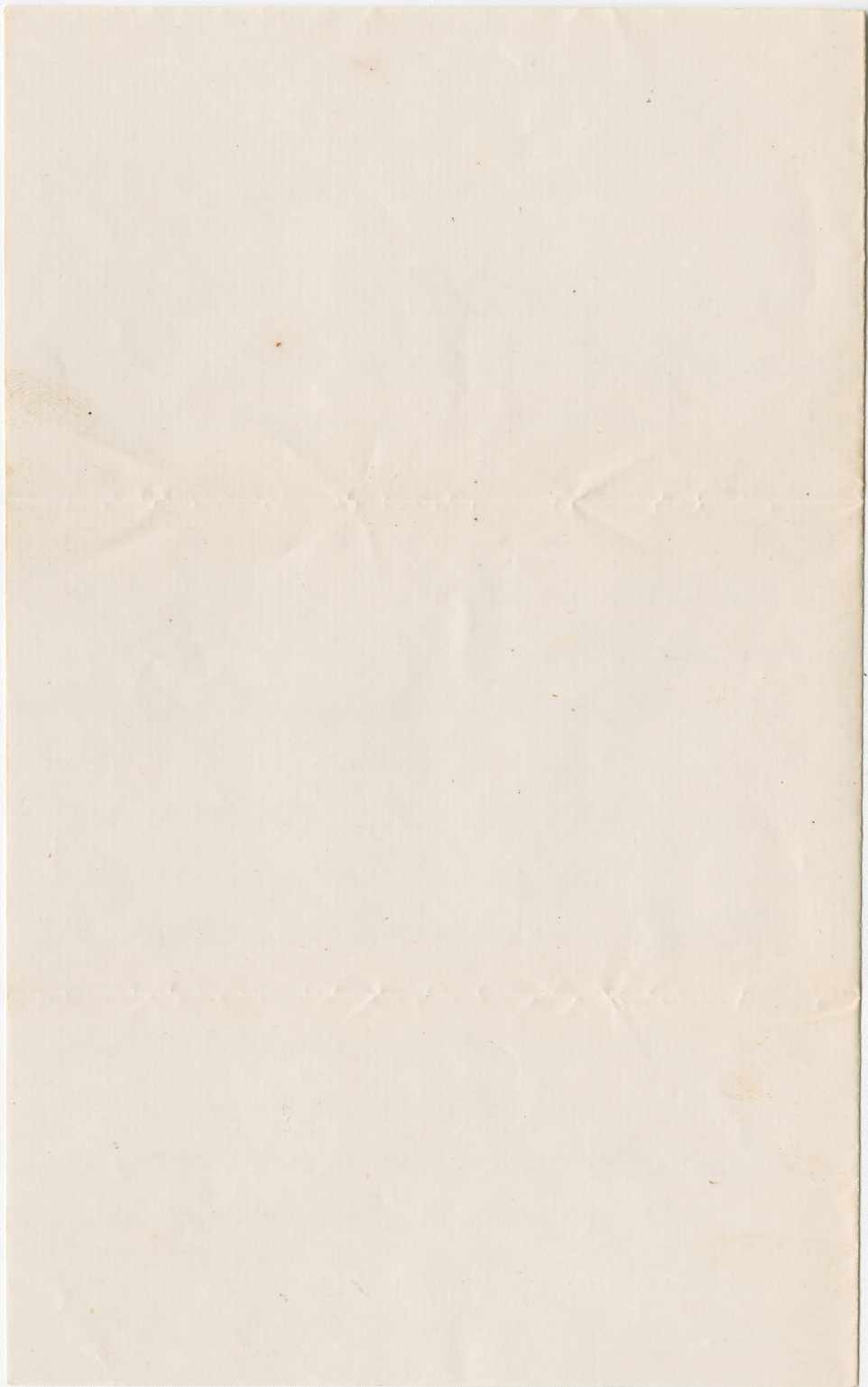
Dear Friend
