Libanon Dec 14th 1830

My Dear Uncle

Permit me to intrude a line upon
your patience and ask the favour
of doing for me a little errand -
which is to call at B^r Anderson's and
get for me a strengthening plaster of
a certain description, said to be good
for one afflicted with a weakness &
and pain in the back - he will
know the kind to which I refer -
having himself recommended it to
me during the last summer -

This dull, damp weather joined
with some exposure has produced
a return of my old affliction -
during the last week I have suffer-
ed considerable - Can you send
me the two last numbers of the "Star-
vant", - or at least all the numbers that
contain a "review" of the Radical
Constitution - Should it be continued
in any numbers that have not come
to hand have the goodness to send
them as they arrive, they shall be safely
returned - Last week I received
a letter from our mutual friend
D. Young he still continues in feeble
health
