My dear Sir

I calculate if providence
permet to leave this City with my family
about the first of October for Cincinnati
I have written also to Bro. Spencer on
the subject, and especially in relation to
obtaining for me a house to reside in,
and have taken the liberty of referring
him to you, as knowing my family
and what sort of house would suit us
As you have been a "D^r of Society for
twenty years past" I thought I might im-
-pose this burden on you in behalf
a preacher, who expects to reside in your
diocese, and be under your fostering wing,
and in whose friendship I fully confide. The
undertaking is great, trust those the
Lord will prosper me in it

My first intention was to have
been at your Conference, but I find
I could not be ready so soon, as to
enable me to reach it in time -

If you could aid in procuring private boarding for us for a short time you would confer a favor. As we could not be well accommodated in one house we should have of course to decide.

I have heard that my son William has joined the Church, and that he is at present living in Cincinnati as my bro. fosters him.
