Rushville Rush co. Indi March-26 - 1833
 Dear Bro I arrived at home yesterday, and
 received beneath your letter my health is
 not very good my family is all well may
 the blessing God rest on you & yours whether
 you are sick or well with you I regard
 that our God is taking the world on Layt
 Saturday & Sunday my quarterly meeting
 was holden in ~~congress~~ will connersville it was
 a time of power & great glory may our
 Annual rise on until he shall conquer
 the world your Bro. Joseph has sent
 me a deed but it is nothing but a gift
 claim this will not do I must have a general
 warrant this is but just between man & man
 your Bro Sprank left my house this
 morning he says that Joseph is indebted to
 him sixty dollars, money that Sprank owed
 out of the school fund to pay for Joseph's
 Land he came yesterday to enter but I
 however prevented on him to wait until
 could right to you to you, wish me to
 say to you that he will wait until the first
 of June & no longer I think he can prove
 that Joseph got the money but how the
 matter now stands between them I do not tell
