 Dear Father  
 I Received your welcome letter  
 and am sorry to hear of your affliction  
 but the Lord knows best what is right  
 for us. I left Phil<sup>a</sup> in January last  
 and moved to this Place, it appears to  
 me there is a work for me to do here  
 we have preaching every two weeks, and  
 a society of thirty members. but there is  
 no money salaries it requires hard fighting  
 to keep ground, but since I have been  
 here the Lord has been with me I feel  
 willing to resign all for the sake of My  
 Master. I have a Large concern of business  
 entrusted in my care. so I employ about two hundred  
 men. in all my temporal concerns I  
 wish to glorify God. and if I can be the  
 Instrument of smothering one soul from the  
 Devil I will do it, I have good it is to serve  
 the Lord because his yoke is Easy and his  
 burden is Light. The Christian has the  
 Promise of the Life that never is and that  
 which is to come. When I came to this Place  
 I saw mountains in the way but the  
 Lord sent them all away. there was  
 many drinking Witches other employe  
 here. but I rise the standard and all  
 that would not come to that I told  
 them to leave, and as soon as I  
 discharge one drunken man there  
 was a sober or Religious one in his  
 Place I have good it is to live to the  
 Glory and Honor of God

My wish is if the Lord Wishes me, to try to  
get to the West but it is uncertain about  
my getting there next spring, as it will  
take some time to get my concerns arranged  
in Jersey my salary here is a liberal one  
I get \$500 of annum my Family Expenses  
all paid, but when I go I want to  
get Mrs You. but I shall first wish  
to rent, and not purchase for some time  
I am your unworthy Joseph L Hollingsworth  
Our much esteemed father

We were glad to receive a let-  
ter from you not knowing whether we should ever receive another  
er from you & it was doubly welcome removed as we are from  
our former friends & many ~~of~~ blessed privileges which we  
formerly enjoyed & for which I often sigh. But the Lord is  
with us Glory to his name I have experienced much of ~~his~~ good-  
ness since I last wrote & have had some deep waters to wade  
thru but the Lord has kept & supported me & my face is yet  
Lionward Yea I am daily astonished at his goodness towards me  
feeling myself to be a weak unprofitable creature I must say that  
I enjoy a sense of his presence daily & feel that Jesus is mine & I am  
his & pray for me that I may ever sit at the feet of Jesus & nothing  
distract, nothing esteem, but Jesus crucified - Sister Sarah He is with <sup>the</sup> she  
desires to be remembered to you. Our children Henry, Ellen &  
Maria are well & enjoy much better health here than they had  
did in the city. I cannot tell what pleasure it would give me  
to see <sup>you</sup> your dear family but we do expect to have the pleasure  
of seeing you in our father's house above, O what a joyful meeting  
shall we there have with many of our dear friends & the millions  
who have gone before my soul exults at the thought that  
we may urge on our rapid course, We have a flourishing Sabbath  
School here of <sup>which</sup> Joseph is Superintendent. He has also a class  
under his care & I trust his labors will prove a blessing to many  
in this place. We feel much interested for the youth and our  
care & we hope eventually to hear from their inquiries as they  
shall be needed, We have also formed a Missionary Society among  
the females, We do pray that a blessing may rest on our feeble efforts  
to extend the blessing of the Gospel, please remember me to your family  
& be assured I still remain yours in the Lord
