Baltimore November 2<sup>d</sup> 1833

My dear Brethren

I find that our highly esteemed brother Dr John Mc

Howland is about removing to the western country, will call in  
your city, and perhaps tarry for a day or two, therefore I take this opportunity  
of saying to you, that altho his destination shall be far beyond you, yet you  
can, and I hope will say to your friend, who are immediately under your  
care, and then by letter, to such, as may live where he may wish to settle  
that Dr Howland, stands high, deservedly high, in this city, as a Physician  
we are sorry, very sorry to loose him, on this subject, however he will I  
have no doubt, have testimonials, from persons better qualified to judge than  
I am - As a member of the church, he stands unspotted, in doctrine  
and discipline, he is of the real Wesleyan order, and has borne his part  
there in our late struggle, in defending our heavenly approved plan  
he leaves us, with our prayers, that heaven may preserve, and prosper him  
you may say, also, that his talents, will render him useful in any  
office, in church or state
