Know ye, That Thomas S. Armstrong a  
Lieutenant of Captain J. M. Williams  
Company, (D,) 122 Regiment of Ohio Infantry  
VOLUNTEERS who was enrolled on the sixteenth day of August  
one thousand eight hundred and seventy two to serve three years or  
during the war, is hereby **Discharged** from the service of the United States  
this Twenty Sixth day of June, 1865, at Near Washington  
D. C. by reason of S. O. 26 of S. Army of the Potomac  
(No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.)\*

Said Thomas S. Armstrong was born in Licking Co  
in the State of Ohio, is Twenty nine years of age,  
Five feet Ten inches high, Fair complexion, Grey eyes,  
Sandy hair, and by occupation, when enrolled, a Teacher

Given at Near Washington D. C. this Twenty Sixth day of  
June 1865.
