Sept 9, 1863

Dear father & mother. There is a flag of truce up. I am hearty. Still in Hospital but pretty nearly recovered. If you get any assurance that we are not to be exchanged, send me a box. Pay express to Fort Monroe. I want military cap No. 7 1/2, 2 faberhead pencils, nos. 2 & 4, comb, toothbrush, a light pair shoes, envelopes, paper, stamps, ginger, pills, socks, flannel shirts, ground coffee, tea, plate tin, tin cup, knife, fork, & spoon, pen knife, sugar, pens, ink, drawing paper, writing paper, diary, drawing colors, kat tail file & 3 cornered file & Mother knows. You know what I will need in cold weather in a box about 24 by 18 inches. Don't have to pay from Fort Monroe to this place (a towel) needles. I am well treated, feel comfortable, plenty to eat, nice weather. Only write 1 page or I won't get it. Direct the box
