Dear Brother

I had folded up the papers relating to the case of Bro. Burk to leave in Bro. Spencers care for you, and thought I had done so, until I came home, I suppose through the press and multiplicity of business I must have omitted it.

I now inclose them to you, with a few of my own remarks on the subject. Bro. Burk is held in respectful and grateful recollections, by many of the old Methodists in Tennessee, they look back to the time when infant Methodism in the Cumberland settlements was within the destructive grasp of Mr. Haw, one of O'Kelly's men, and William Burk was the man, who raised the standard against the enemy, and who in the hands of God saved the infant church from destruction.
