

Libby Prison Richmond Va Nov 29 63

Dear Bro. Yours of the 8 inst I rec'd on the 27. I was glad to hear what you told me. You & father are doing a good business in the sheep line. Well a new home I suppose you can pay for it in 3 years that is making 2813.25 dollars per year. I would like to be out and see you and see your affairs working.

I haven't any doubt that father is as good a manager as could be found of sheep growers in your region. Well that will you a basis. Stop rent & make father & mother a house.

I got Marys of the 16 inst the same time I got yours. I will need the things I sent for. I suppose you look for me to be out soon. Not very probable. Give my love to father & mother and to Mary, "Flav," Frank, and Gus. Tell them I hope to see them when I get out.

I will likely get a furlough when I get out of here. Don't forget to write me. Write whether you hear from me or not. Take good care of yourself. Good night. Have you seen Harper's Weekly?
