Wilmington Ohio Feb 27th 1839
Dear Father.

A very solemn scene
has past in our town within the
last few days - Brother Barrett
was taken very unwell on Thursday
morning last, & was very sick through
that night, but no special danger
was apprehended by us, untill the next
morning at daylight, when he commenced
sinking very fast, & expired at 10, Clo-
ck P. M. He died in great peace with-
out a single struggle. As I hope to
be in Germantown in a few days
I will now undertake to give
you all the particulars. The trial
pending in Hamilton seemed to rest
on his mind in his last hours - but
so it is he is gone to return no more.
I feel myself greatly bereaved for
I loved my dear colleague much.
Sister Barrett deeply mourns her irre-
parable loss but is much engaged in
prayer for grace & resignation. She wish-
es you to let me know when I come
to your town when you can come over
& see her, write his biography, & preach
his funeral. I wrote a very short no-
tice to the W. C. Advocate in compliance with
the request of the friends in this place
