I am blessed with a reasonable degree of health. I left Richmond on the 7th inst. We are in Camp Oglethorpe at this place. I hope you are well and doing well but I am sorry that I am in such a condition as I am. But there are other & better men than me prisoners. I hope to be exchanged some day. We have good drinking water & a ground to exercise upon. Tis said this place is very healthy. I hope so. I hope to hear from you soon. I have got to stay here until I'm exchanged. Please write to Mary. Well I must close. Direct as usual "By flag of truce." Yours as ever, farewell.
