Dear Sir

Dr. Prescott called on me this morning requesting advice as to what he had best do not being employed by the Conference & I proposed writing to you In expectation of being received & of removing immediately he had given up all idea of Law & of course is principally out of business he does not complain at all - but says he must recommence the practice of Law (however much against his feelings) so that he may provide for his family - will you write to me or him immediately for I have told him you may have some private arrangement for him - he is willing to go any where I believe now or if better in the Spring provided he can have assurance from you that he would be employed then please understand he will be governed by you if you say go to any where he will or otherwise he looks up to you for present direction he wants you to write to Rock R. Conference if you think best do you let him know -

Bro Hill told me you learned at the con-

please suspend any judgment in that case
until you come to Merica I could but I will
not now say any more about it
we are all firmly here since conference
I fancy it may settle in peace -
Call on me (if you can) when you come
to town
