Bellfonte June 12. 1842

My Dear Dr. Finley

Your letter of the 5th Inst. came
me a Deed from Mr. Coad to Father Daulesses for two
small tracts of land in Frenchland came to my hand
this forenoon. I much regret to tell you that Mr. Coad is
completely with your request, but he declined
to take up this deed and presents a new one directly
to you for the same land, for reasons which were not
entirely satisfactory to my mind.

I enclose with me also the same deed with my official
attestation for which I make you charge, and I desire
to let you know that you will get want the certificate
of the President Judge of the (4th) Judicial
circuit that I am Clerk of the court before the
~~Fastidious~~ Records of Jasper County in Frenchland
will consider it a legal document, though this
may not be the case.

I learn from Mr. Coad that your land lies six miles
from ~~Newton~~ which is the county seat of Jasper
County, Pa. between the Dunker Creek and the Susquehanna
River. You may address Bro. John G. Parkison
formerly of this vicinity or Saml. Reed, son of old
Bro. Andrew Reed who resided some years since in
Greene Co. in this State, at whose house you have
often preached as far as I am informed, or Dennis or John
Coad late of Stanfield in Greene Co. all of whom
now bear your land, and Parkison & the Coads
particularly as they selected and entered the land for
Mr. Coad here.

I thank you Bro. Finley for the kind adver-
sation contained in the latter part of letter, and duly
