

Rev. J.B. Finley Dear Brother

Through the goodness of God I am yet spared among the living, and have the privilege of addressing my cherished friend. The incidents of our early acquaintance has been such as to render our attachment strong and I am sure you will be glad to hear from me.

Since I last wrote to you the Lord has been gracious to us. The cause of religion has prospered more abundently than years heretofore. Between 50 and 60 have been added to the church during the winter and spring. My soul feels encouraged. The prospect is decidedly favorable.

My own feeble exertions have been frequently seconded with powers from on <u>high</u>. The Lord encourages and blesses me as in former days. He is the same God and although bodily strength is declining, I feel as much as ever determined to spend my life upon the Watch Tower of Zion, in striving to do good to my people, the Lord always being my helper. Through grace I expect to meet all of my Christian friends in heaven.
