Dear Br Finley

I embrace this moment to say to you we are all well and I trust you & yours are enjoying the same blessing I was hoping to hear of your safe return you had a long and tedious trip and one that was attended with much anxiety of mind but I trust all things will result in good. I was pleased to see the firm stand the exhibited by <sup>the</sup> North and West in the case of Bishop Anderson and the reply of A certain Committee in defense of their Position against Mr. H. Bascom. both Politically and in Church matters I believe the South has claimed too much and it is high time the Free States was waking up. only see the late movements of John C. Calhoun and John Tyler and A number of Texas land Speculators about to involve our nation in A war with Mexico about annexation of that country to our Union but I trust the good Lord will direct the Ship of State as well as our beloved Zion, to harbor of Safety. well Br Finley I wish to take A transfer to your camp and if you think proper you will send A line to Bishop Mough on that Subject as I am A stranger to him you will know what to say on this Subject direct to Council Dover by Camp which will be the 15<sup>th</sup> of August we have some prosperity on this dist and peace in our borders I believe the small
