Pleasant Hill June 9th 1846

Dear Sir

last Sat we recd your which found us in our usual health nothing new but Hawkins made up a volunteer company for Texas and Greenup has gone with them they left on Monday for Cin. there were hundreds to see them go and many tears shed I have the promise of a young man from Ia next week we are at our corn hip & thigh William & me and will be able to accomplish it I think with hard work we were out to see the children week before last all well James has a daughter Betsy is doing well or may do if he will only manage well he can see all he can make had bought the second film its now being dry corn & grass melts by the sun and our pasture is getting short Charles had a shock last Sat but is now at his school Hannah is well and doing well you named my going to Huxcock in your last but this will be out of my power this summer as to Charles he says if he dont go to Columbus he will take the school at Aley^d for a year E Odell has bought a five acre lot 1/2 mile from Betan on the Winchester Road for 500 00 & says he will move in the spring at farist I expected you would have said something about your going to England to the worlds convention as you have been appointed the reserve delegate & E says he cant go I paid Odell and am to pay it back by the 1 July no more worth saying yours as ever till death John Lettbrooke
