Dear Grandpa

McMinn Monday Morning June 23rd 1816
Respected Grandfather

Week came duly to hand from which I learned the Condition in reference to the birth in your City and I should have come out as you advised me but for my health I had attacked some few days previous to the reception of your letter with theague or intermitent fever I continued to shake for some time every other day And Mother would not hear to my leaving home I had intended our starting immediately but Mother seemed so opposed to my leaving home in my present health that I thought it advisable to remain at home for the present and I well knew if I did go I should afflict her very considerably My health is fit very indifferent I shake out day and teach the next so that I operate on the every other day principle My quarter expired on Wednesday the 1st ~~the 1st~~ instant this morning I commenced another quarter the Citizens of this place would not hear to my quitting I had thoughts of going near Egton and taking a School but they said that they would not give me up on any considerations I had some sort of competition for the School but they informed me that I could have the School as long as I wanted and they did not like to give me under 16 months at least. Although the School will expire in three weeks from the above date she gets along finely.

her School as often, as convenience
will admit and help her by advice
and experience of which in the latter I
have made some considerable. She has an
interesting School. our folks when I was
last at home were all well. Mr & Mrs
Wisher was in last week on a visit they
report general health. We shall
look for you on the 29th Instal.
I believe I have wrote all that
would interest you at the present
