Letter from R.M. Hannah to John Meloy

R.M. Hannah

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Eaton July 26th - 1841 -

Respected friend John Meloy
I again take the liberty of addressing a few lines
to you hoping they may find you in health
as they leave us at present as for myself
I got thrown from my Carriage in Hamilton
about 10 days ago and got my head cut and
otherwise bruised a good deal I was on my
way to the City but I had to return home
but I am so far recovered that I shall go
to Cin: tomorrow we saw the new Mr. Finley
him a few weeks ago he said he should
have a Conference with the governor as soon
As possible on your Case and little Orphans as both
your petition are at Columbus the people in town
Come up well on your petition as I think
almost every one signed it indeed no one
refused that was asked not one that I know of
In our town every thing has been done here that
can be done and we feel confident that the
governor will pay attention to your Case
before long as we have done all he asked
And I doubt not but he will be as good
as his word - your mother and father Jane
and Volney & Maria are all well
our Sarah, Eliza and our little girls are all well
we hope to see you here again before Christmas
at the very farthest
