Dear Mr. Finley -

at a meeting of the Trustees of  
the M. E. Church of this place, called by the Pastor  
in charge, and held on yesterday, I was appointed  
a committee to <sup>reply to</sup> a communication presented by Mr.  
Swain before the board of Trustees, written by your  
self. The board of Trustees authorize me to  
say to you that they are prepared to substantiate  
the fact that you promised when the build-  
ing of the Church was commenced, and while  
it was progressing, that you would see the Trus-  
tees out - that they should proceed with the  
work and have no fears as to the money, for  
you would see to raising ~~that~~ it: and in view  
of that, and full view of all the circumstances,  
they cannot consent to release you from the  
obligations to which you refer in your Communi-  
cation, nor as a Trustee of the Church until those  
claims are paid. And further that they ex-  
pect you to fulfil, to the letter, your promises.


You will of course pursue such course as to you may seem best.  
We hope, however, that all unnecessary litigation

will be avoided, and that in the future investigation  
and settlement of the difficulties between you and  
said board of Trustees, the glory of God and the  
good of the cause may be had in view, and that  
no bitter or unpleasant feelings may be permitted  
to have an existence in our hearts.
