Dear Lotta this morning I received two drs^s of your paper and I suppose to try to harass my mind with things, what you will say about me and I say now to you I want you to send no more. Have lost all confidence in you as an honorable man. You have treated me badly as the best and finest friend you ever had and I look upon as iniquitous as the worst exhibition of the human heart. I went nothing to do with you & all you can say about me I know will not injure me one iota. Wait no controversy with you and hope you may yet have gratitude enough just to let me be at peace. All the arguments you could use in a life time of words be as long as Mather's will not sharpen my mind. I am your much injured & well treated friend — J. B. Finley —
