My Dear Brother Finley

But now to my subject, I ~~believe~~ believe I never tried to get any Particular Preacher. But I think our situation at this time requires a Preacher of some good qualification and standing as a Speaker <sup>and</sup> perseverance, now don't laugh for such is the fact. I will now venture to mention some who I think would do well here. I will say that G. W. Walker would be received here with open arms I do assure you we must have some such man if it is only for one year and Walker is the man that will suit for it is the general expression of the Brethren here. How then Brother Finley do you gratify us by using your influence with the Cabinet to get Walker here if you will you shall never know what I will do for you
