Dear Brother

Kindly I take up my pen in haste to say to you that Bishop Soule has taken exceptions to the truthfulness of some parts of Dr Elliott's review of ~~some parts~~ his course in leaving the M & C Church, and the circumstances under which he left the church and particularly that part in which he speaks of him as having left the church under or liable to charges. Mr Soule called on Dr Elliott this morning to know by what authority he made such statements and he Dr E gave you as authority. Dr Elliott understood you to say that you had written to Soule that you should prefer charges against him. I suppose that they will write to you on the subject and if they do they will involve the Dr and you in difficulty. I write to put you on your guard and to request you to be ready for any movement that they may make. Please write to Dr Elliott immediately and state what you did and intended to do if Bishop Soule had not left the M & C Church.
