Cincinnati O. April 17th 1868
Dear Bro. Hinley
I learn that you are now at Eaton, and write to that place. I am informed that Bishop Scoble is determined to be at General Conference, and will probably do his best to draw confusion into our ranks. I fear very much that the name of Dr. Bond will be virtually given up all to the South; still I hope for the best. I wish you would be in town on Saturday and spend the night with me. As nearly as we can learn, on Wednesday will be time enough to start, and then we will arrive in Pittsburgh on Saturday morning and will be in time to get to an advertising before night, in good time. The Nashville paper comes out on a page and a half addressed to the General Conference, maintaining that the heresy, as they interpret it, is an unalterable law of the church. We will

have lots of southerners, I suppose to annoy us. Come prepared to ~~have~~ meet the attack. I expect my long article on the pro-slavery of the South, will make some stir; but it is the truth, say what may please. Perhaps we may let out on Tuesday, yet I think we will have time enough on Wednesday. Much more when I see you. Yours in faith
