Albany March 17 1830

Dear Bro Finley  
I had a two days  
meeting at Wellfountain last Sat. &  
Sun. It was thought to be a profitable  
meeting. I find the money said  
to have been put into your hands by  
some of the managers of the missionary  
and tract society of that circuit was  
all acknowledged (\$5.57) in the  
Annual report of the Ohio conference  
missionary society as received  
from <sup>Wellfountain</sup> ~~that~~ circuit per John W. Clark.  
This you may see in the 163<sup>rd</sup> No of  
the advocates. The only mistake  
seems to be, that all instead of  
half was given to the missionary  
society. The board having decided  
that half of the \$5.57 shall be applied  
to the purchase of tracts.

I thought it would be a relief to  
your mind to have this information

It is impossible for me to know  
who is accountable for the mis-  
take which has occurred in the  
application of the funds of the  
Greenmountain Society and it is dif-  
ficult to devise any plan by  
which that mistake can be remedied

perhaps you can think of  
some method by which Bro. Clark  
could explain or rectify the  
matter to the satisfaction of the  
people.

My family are in usual health  
Mat Wright joins me in expressions
