Yours of Lamp 18th (from
Sandusky) was rec'd in due time.
I was as I always am glad to hear
From you.—

The materials out of which we are
to make that Missoury report
are so scarce & meagre that I am
completely stump'd I expect however
to see the other members of the
Com. Perhaps they have more
strength or ingenuity — For it appears
that unless decitability or malability, or
both can be found in the little map —
The Report must be both short and
meanin' — the religious part especially;
But my only object when I sat down

was to answer your enquiry "When
the Rev wife of you go to Gen. Con".?
The last Dell I shall attend before —
will be Granville Cir. M Chalfants
Ape 19 & 20th — The next Sabbath is of
course the 27th & 3 days is too little to
reach Pittsburgh in — So I will
come home 21st of Apries & meet
you at my house or if you can
meet me at Chalfants Home home
with me.

I think to go on horse back & I wish
you to write to me that you will
be on soon enough to go before the
great going, or wait in patience
till they are gone, or take some by
way that we may not be too much
crowded. you see all I mean —

* more the day in you for there is 1st
a week to go & come. one — I am
getting old & don't wish to hurry

Our good Friends have done the
Church & I hope the reformers in Bol-
timore a great service by expelle
ing most of their Preys & a goodly
number of their common members
now they may have at least some
appearance of honesty attached to
the delusion of their Reformation
my 1st Sheet is almost full — Don't
& believe me when I say Dear
