My old friend Jameson May 23rd 44
Bro. Jamison told me this morn-
ing that you passed through town
yesterday & wished me to write to you.
This I should have done as you requested
in your last letter to me, if you had not
intimated that you expected to visit Law-
er's & record here before Gen. Con.
You have requested me to "Study & write to
you my opinion on the "plan & division" of
the church & her funds.
Now I have neither room, time, nor incli-
nation to say much on this momentous sub-
ject, for the last Gen. Con. with regard to
this subject did nothing but what was wrong
and yet their ways were not all alike
for the plan for dividing the church is
totally contrary to all known laws either in
heaven or on earth. But there is no law
violated in recommending the A. Conference
to concurred in dividing the funds. This might
have been done constitutionally, whether it
would have been expedient, is another question.
I hope you will declare all the acts of last
Gen. Con. on this subject null & void, and
then make the best apology you can to God
the church & the world for the evil done. This
perhaps you cannot do better, than to again
recommend an equitable division of the
funds to the Am. Conference. I am aware
that many of our good brethren dissent from
these opinions, & say the "Gen. Con. did not
divide the church". Now I say the same. But
why should it always be forgotten. Let the
Gen. Con. & it did make the ~~and~~ ^{now} the ~~judge~~ ^{of}

tho' a judicious responsible committee
Can't you get a Pittsburgh editor in whom the church
would have more confidence?

I have thought about writing you at all
but am disengaged in the lower parts of my spine
and may not be able.

My wife would have
very glad to see you she is quite feeble
with the above exception I am in tolera-
ble health for an old man.
