March 24th 1849

Bra Tin Cup. Of the last time I send you

I have seen your report
& infer that it is not necessary for you to
leave tho you may think it expedient so to
do. If you back out this spring can you
not come over & see us before you go to
Easter? You have had all sorts of ho-
licists at Columbus this winter. Whigs
Democrats. Free-file & Obstruction mixed
up in such proportions as earth never saw!
My wife has been sick two weeks - is
now a little - sits up half the day —
she says she would like to see you. I am
not very well — but am grateful for
the health I enjoy.

Christ Jesus our Lord.
