You have had all sorts of politics at Columbus this winter, Whigs Democrats, Free-Soil & Abolition mixed up in such proportions as south never saw! My wife has been sick two weeks - is now a little - sits up half the day - she says she would like to see you. I am not very well - but am grateful for the health I enjoy.
