Nearest to us from Cairy to Findlay two Stages pass is every
Day there inquire for Thornton Cundiff he will bring you
Amediatey to My house and when you want to return some
of us will take you back to Findlay it is 12 Miles our quarterly
Meeting will be the first Saturday and Sunday in April
and we shold be glad if you could be hear at that time
It will be in ^{our} Church in Cannonsburgh 1 Mile from my
House you wish to no how this place wold suit for a potter
I have asked several of the Neighbours they with my self
think it wold first shate and those that are judges say the
Clay is good and plenty for that Busyness the Distance
from Cairy to Findlay is fifteen Mile from Findlay to
Cannonsburgh twelve Mile Dear Brother write to me
As soon as you get these lines I remain your friend
