Dear Brother I wrote you a few lines to let you no that we
are well except bad colds hoping to hear that you are well
I have several things to write to you first George Bridgman
has cleared and fenced his land recently David Little has
prepared the old house and has 8 or 9 acres in wheat and wishes
to no if he chte in large the improve ment and on what
terms William Bridgman wants to take a leas of ten
acres and on what terms I think there has been some
trespass on your timber as I do not no where your lines
are they deny the trespass I think you had better get
your land run out and well marked and that may decide
all disputes I shold be verry glad to see you and have
you preach one more we have Circuit preaching
in our Church it is not yet plastered our society
is small and poor and we are now \$100 in debt to
Dr Eaton for payments he made in building our Church
Dear Brother write to as soon as you get these lines
And let me no how you wish me to transact your
Buiness here and let me no when think you will
come out here Give our respects to Sister Emily
I conclude as your friend
