Scioto County Feb. 3. 1849
Dear Brother Finley

I have taken my seat to inform you that I am yet in the land amongst the ^{living} and in the enjoyment of good health and I have not forgotten the many pleasant seasons we have had in by gone days But my dear brother I have had to pass some very hard places since I saw you the wife of my youth died in peace and triumph in July 1838 & my last wife left the world ^{many} last & at this time my three youngest children and myself compose the family I have five married and now sir I wish to inquire of you something about our old friend Ransom Hodges who as you know is in the states prison I have understood that you thought he ought to be relieved I have been told there was a great reformation in him please to write to me what is your opinion The whole settlement with a few Exceptions did sign a petition for his release and if we thought he would behave himself we would be pleased to help him out We are right in the best revival of religion that ever I witness
