West Alexandria February 6th 1849

Dear Grandfather I take
this opportunity of dropping you a few lines to inform
you of the good health of the Family in general
Me and Hannah and Child is in moderate health
at this time James Hough is better since you left then
he has been since he has been home the medicine that
you left him a great deal of good the folks at home
is well. I have not heard any thing from Charles and James
since you was at home the business of clothing is moderate at
present I think it will get better in a few weeks the
money is not plenty here the money that I have out
I can't get in a fall and the money that I get in
the cotton business is small Benjamin wants his money
the balance due on the cow that is coming to him
and I have Ben trying to raise it for him and
can't do it and I think I would see if you could
send me a little so as to pay him if not to
send me a few lines to that fact and a big

I could get the money that is owing to me I
would not send and bother you but I can't
but it at the present and Benjamin said
if I did not pay him a good deal next
week that he Benjamin would leave it at the
Squire for collection and I told him that I
