Dayton Feb 16 49
Rev J B Finley,
Dear Brother - yours of yester-
-day came to hand this morning, and I was glad
to hear from you. I fear there is something
wrong about my ^{tax} ie if the Receiver at Finley
Reported truly. He wrote to me that my taxes
were over ten dollars. Now, Bro Finley, I wish
you look into this matter for me. My land
is taxed one quarter section, and one eighty acre
lot joining, making in all 3.80 acer lots.
The sixty acres I sold to William Mully, he
is to pay the tax on.

We have very cold weather
here at this time - some sickness and some
deaths. Old Butter Broadwell was laid on
his Wednesday - he died of a few days sickness
in hope of a better country; where the inhabitants
shall never say they are sick. I am much
afflicted from a recent cold - though I am well as
house as I was a few days ago. Mrs Walker is
in tolerable health. We shall be glad to see you
and have you stay all night with us as you home.
I expect to be at home on the 13 of March - If I should
not I will see you at your own house as I shall be
at Canada quo meeting the Sabbath before.
