Dear Bros

I have now got back again
in my own house we are in tolerable
good health except my wife who is in bed
the greater part of the time. There is an
effort making here to oust the great
Democratic nest at the University of Denver
& all which I hope to see done Gregory
will go for a change so I am informed
Bourne has become well but about it
I W. Meligan seems to be making an effort
again but I think you might do something
toward getting rid of it there you might
find some men that would meet the wishes
of the 2 directors there there will be a
sweep of clerks D. workers doctors & chaplains
down to the local guards

That would put our town & Co. in a man
healthy feeling as to whigery
The vote was taken yesterday for & against
subscription for the 3 rail roads to Calumbeo
& it was lost here - I think they have a
very poor chaplain at the O B now
not very creditable to our church
it is known to you & many others that men of
talent sit under the direction there & they expect
to hear a sermon
