May Ohio March 8. 1852

Dear Bro. Finley

What in the world has become of you. I have been looking every week for a letter from you in Lion's Herald. How is it now has come out. Have they scared Stevens or what has happened. Perhaps however you have changed your mind and have not written. Let me hear from you soon.

We have had a wonderful revival of religion here - It has been in progress nearly two months. The fruit of the meeting is 280 conversions and 274 ~~conversions~~ accessions - In all since Conference 290. Surely we have abundant cause of gratitude to God. Of those received about 80 are heads of families - 75 young men - 12 children - and the balance young women. I never have witnessed any thing equal to it. I want you to come over and see us soon again. Your last visit afforded us unusual gratification - I trust you will find time and strength to come again - superannuated as you are. I hope you still intend to go to Boston. You must not on any account give up this idea. You can do more for the cause of "toleration" than all the rest of us put together. When you write please let me know your mind on this matter - We are in usual health - but perfectly worn down and exhausted - Hence it is our design to spend this week in Dayton to rest. It would be very pleasant to meet you there. We shall remain until Friday. Our Quarterly Meeting will commence on Saturday - I would press you to come to see us then - only that I believe a visit at some other time would be more pleasant to you. My wife joins me in the kindest remembrances to sister F. yourself - and all the family - The Lord bless you
