German town Sept 24th 7.

Dear Brother

I recently received a friendly letter from you; and was glad to hear from you, that after the laborious time we had at conference, you were able not only to be up and a-bout, but to hold forth thence on the Sabbath. I have been quite afflicted & ailed since the Saturday night after conference adjourned, the affection has held to day and is discharging a dead full secretion from the left nostril, and I hope I shall feel better in a few days. As to your Books, I should be glad to assist you in any way that I can, but you will perceive that Piqua Fremont and Altoona are no longer in my District, but in the Urbana District, so that I can not to be any supervisor over any Books that you may have in that region. I hope we shall have a prosperous year in the Ohio Conference. I have not yet been able to secure a young man for Frankfort Ct; nor do I know whether or not Brother Mosgrove has gone on to Detroit. I wish you would make some inquiry, and if he has not gone on tell him, that I am depending upon him to fill that place. I saw Brother H. C. Brooke last Monday evening at the near Cincinnati bridge, he said the family were in usual health. I understood that you were inclined to think the more in our conference to elect delegates favorable to Southern interest was of course wrong. I wish to say that you are mistaken in that view; to my certain knowledge there were a number of the members that did all they could against the election of Brother Raper, on account of his views and opinions on the property question. So narrow will I come inance my own meetings and shall have one every week to the end of the year. I shall be glad to see you
