See brother 16 Pittsburgh June 24th 1823.

Grace & mercy from God the Father & our Lord
Jesus Christ by the Holy Spirit be with you all &
Save you and yours evermore & amen.

We have been lately informed in this place by
the promise of our worthy brother Elliott your colleague
who informed us of the gracious reception the gospel
of God our Saviour has met with amongst our
brethren of the Wayandale Nation - and that having
seen it they have found it to be as it is indeed
the truth the power of God unto salvation Moreover
that the many of the children are gathered together
in a regular school where they are especially instructed
to read the book of God - that is sufficient to make
them wise unto salvation - that they are fine children
born with great facility and promise to be ornaments
in the enlightened Christian world - Truly all this
is of that God who is rich in mercy and abundant
in goodness and truth toward all the creatures he
hath made - our very souls rejoice at such
good and glorious news - while we heartily commend
pray that God may carry on the good work until
all things shall be made anew. until all

Nations Friends Longward People shall bow with
diligent submission to his precious step &
every tongue confess Jesus Lord to the Glory of
God the Father

I am ashamed to have to tell you that we
have not as yet in this City shown our Good
will to the Miskenay cause by raising a Miskenay
Society amongst us - last year I fully intended
to do so but several circumstances seemed to
prevent and did prevent us - but I think our
way through Divine Providence is now open before us
and mind immediately to enter into it we believe
it to be a good work and trust we shall enter into
it heartily. I took the advantage of the presence
of brother Whittle and the relations he has to our
congregations of the good work of God amongst our
Indian brethren, and gave out immediately for
our brother & citizens informed to meet on Thursday
evening next to form a Miskenay Society ^{any} looking
with great anxiety to that meeting I know not
what will be done but I hope for great things
as our people here are a benevolent people & the
cause is good.

But my brother I can assure you we have made
of as much proof as we can possibly get of your
success as the people in this part of the country
have been by some people induced to contribute
largely to Miskenay families that have been
burdened among other Indians and have tried
the discouraging & painful (but you offend to
true) influence that they have been doing nothing
and worse than nothing - even getting large establishments
and to conduct themselves as to the best all confidence
amongst the people they have putted to serve

I therefore hope you will endeavor to prevail
on two at least of our Indian brothers -
least one good Indian to come with brother
as soon as possible to this place to be at
our first anniversary meeting - brother Whittle
has promised us he will try to come and conduct
them to this place - and I shall not fix on the
time of our first anniversary until I hear from
you. I have read much good of brother Peter
Thelogs & Morongew - and should be glad to see
them but must leave the choice to you whom to
send - I think if they come they will do us
much good - My sincer love to all the Church of Christ
with your acceptation & of my improved regards - as I
am often run & carried away in love R. Lydig Jr -
