My dear Bro

April the 24. 1819

Through the blessing of a kind  
providence I am still able to pursue my course  
of Travelling, and am now on my way to Canada  
by the way of ~~Stager~~ Niagara. If on my return  
I shall ~~be~~<sup>hear</sup> of you in that Section of the world  
I hope to see you if I have time; my intention was  
to go in by the way of Detroit. but the roads on  
that rout I find to be impassible at this  
season, as such I am very much hurried at  
present: this rout being so much further than  
the other. There is a Camp Meeting <sup>near</sup> at  
Lebanon the last days of July and first of  
August. I should be thankful if you would  
be so good as to meet me there - My reason  
for this request, is of a serious character.  
I find our Friend Burts business is  
taking a serious turn and must be met

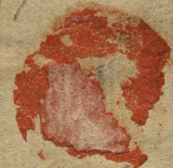


seriously; Therefore my desire is that as many  
of the old Preachers should ~~be~~ <sup>be</sup> there as possible,  
that we may make timely arrangements to  
meet the business — He considers your  
Sentinelle in his suspension, both cruel  
and unconstitutional; done with a view  
to cut him off from an appeal to General  
Conference, yet his intention is to appeal  
and show that you acted contrary to  
your own rule by which you are  
Governed. I have no time to make any  
comments on the subject. Let us meet  
at Ed Camp M — and prepare for the  
worst — I hope untill then you will  
pray for your Bro.
