Readles Station Feb. 6 1830

My dear Bro.

I have, since I saw you, rec^d a letter from Bro
Fowler of Louisville on the subject of our appointment
there; their g. m. will be 14th of March, but they insist on
my coming the first week in April in preference to attending g. m.
in March. They mention you in particular & insist on our coming
together to hold a meeting with them; for they seem to think that
two meetings are better than one; therefore, they are not willing
for us to come to g. m. So preventing Providence I shall be
in Cincinnati to accompany you to Louisville on the evening
of Thursday the 1st of April, and we ought if possible to
leave there Friday morning. — I have rec^d a long letter from Rev. D.
Young; he has not recovered entirely from his fall attack. He
says if the R—s continue to cooperate a little longer, we
shall hear no more of Bill Lewis & Adjet McGuire, than
we now hear of Tom Thumb & Robin Hood.
